Telling a story + short message/email

Learning objectives

- Understand 6 phrasal verbs for school and life.

- Write a short message/email (4–5 sentences) asking for support.

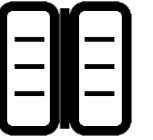


Warm-up: “What happened?”

Prompts (choose ONE):

- I ran into...
- I fell out with...
- I sorted out...

Task: 30 seconds each. Partner A tells a mini-story → Partner B listens and reacts. Rotate once.

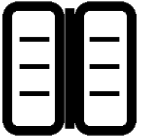


Model text: first read

Read quietly (1 minute). Then answer the gist questions.

- Where?
- When?
- Who?
- What problem?

Keep it short: 1–2 words each.



Noticing + meaning match

Step 1: Underline the 6 phrasal verbs in the model text.

Step 2: **Worksheet 1** — match each phrasal verb to its meaning.

Pair-check → quick whole-class check.



Sentence practice

Worksheet 2: Choose 3 phrasal verbs.

- Write 1 school-life sentence for each (use word bank + starters).
- Share 2–3 examples.



Telling a story

Goal: 6–8 sentences using at least 3 target phrasal verbs

Worksheet 3: Telling a story

Beginning → Middle → End

Write quietly. (Early finishers: add “What I learned ...”)



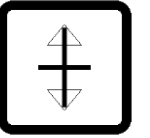
Free writing task

Part 1: Write story (8–10 sentences) using 4 or more phrasal verbs.

Part 2: Message/email (4–5 sentences): what happened + what you need + polite close.

Use word bank/suggested sentences if needed.

Optional: oral plan with partner (2 minutes).



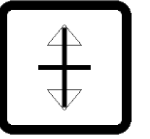
Grammar mini-lesson

Separable vs inseparable phrasal verbs

Inseparable: run into, fall out with → cannot be broken up.

Separable: sort out, make up (with) → noun can split;
pronoun **MUST** split.

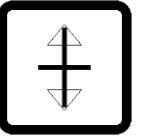
Key rule: sort it out  | sort out it

Quick reference

- run into = meet by chance
- fall out (with) = argue
- make up (with) = be friends again
- calm down = relax
- turn up = arrive
- sort out = solve a problem
